WRAPPING UP THURSDAY: The RailCats clawed their way out of a 3-0 hole to beat the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks 5-4, winning two of three in the series. **Mike Rohde's** first hit of the game was the afternoon's biggest, plating the winning run with two outs in the ninth on a sharply hit grounder up the middle. The RailCats tied the game on **Mike Massaro's** two-out, pinch hit double in the eighth and won for just the fifth time in 15 tries vs. Fargo this year.

FEELIN' .500: Thursday's win made the RailCats a .500 team for the first time in more than a month. After failing in four attempts to reach the break even mark in June, the 'Cats got to 22-22 with the win yesterday and moved into a three-way tie for second place in the league. The RailCats were last over .500 on May 25 (6-5) after a 4-2 victory over the Goldeyes.

A HAPPY HOME: The RailCats have found their stride during their longest homestand of the season, winning five of the first six games during the current nine-game stand. The RailCats are a league-best 15-7 at home and the difference has been on the mound. At U. S. Steel Yard, RailCats pitchers boast a 3.30 ERA (6.46 on the road) and have given up 13 home runs (33 on the road). The 'Cats have actually hit slightly better (.255) away from home.

STOP, THIEF!: For the second year in a row, no Northern League team has been tougher to steal bases against than the RailCats. **Anthony Esquer** and **Brett Wallace** have helped cut down an even 40% (20-of-50) potential base stealers, giving the RailCats both more caught stealings and less successful stolen bases against than any other team on the circuit.

FISH FREE: Since the Goldeyes won four straight from the RailCats June 9-11, the 'Cats have been a surging ballclub, going 12-6 from that point on. The club has been especially potent at home, winning 11 of their last 13 games at U. S. Steel Yard, and this weekend's series marks league-leading Winnipeg's first to downtown Gary in 2009. The RailCats and Goldeyes split eight games at the Steel Yard in 2008, including two in the playoffs.

MANAGER GREG TAGERT

Fifth-year RailCats skipper **Greg Tagert** has established himself as one of the top managers in independent baseball after taking the 'Cats to an unprecedented four straight Northern League Championship Series in his first four seasons.

Known for building teams as much on character as on talent, Tagert's RailCats have won at least 51 games every year since 2005 and won titles in 2005 and 2007. The 'Cats have won with dominant pitching (2007) and an explosive offense (2008), and Tagert's 241-188 record in Gary is the best in franchise history. In his RailCats career, Tagert has mentored two Northern League Pitchers of the Year, one Player of the Year and four *Baseball America* All-Independent Leagues selections.

The all-time winningest manager in the Frontier League, Tagert has put together 13 winning seasons in 13 years as a professional manager. Tagert won his 600th career game in 2008 and boasts a lifetime record of 653-524.

PRO CAREER: Played two seasons with Los Angeles Dodgers (1999 & 2000) ... went 3-5 with 4.23 ERA in 83 big league appearances, striking out 88 in 93.2 innings ... originally selected in third round (79th overall) of 1995 Major League Entry Draft out of Waikeia High School ... struck out 75 in 49.1 innings with Yakima in debut season ... named one of Top 10 prospects in Dodgers system by *Baseball America* following 1995 season ... quickly advanced up ladder, making major league debut at age 21 in just fifth professional season ... played one season in Chicago White Sox system before being released during Spring Training 2002 ... retired following release and enrolled full time as a college student at Hawai'i-Hilo, earning degree in business.

A Tradition of Excellence

The Gary SouthShore RailCats are the only team in the history of the Northern League to advance to the Championship Series four years in a row and have established a "Tradition of Excellence" on and off the field.

The RailCats won titles in 2005 and 2007, and have won consistently since Manager **Greg Tagert** was hired before the start of the 2005 season. But the Tradition of Excellence does not begin and end on the field. The RailCats have grown attendance at U. S. Steel Yard since 2003, posting an annual increase each of the team's first five years at their state-of-the-art home and averaging nearly 300 more fans per game in 2008 than in the debut season. The RailCats have drawn better than 160,000 total fans each of the last four years and will proudly attract their one millionth fan to U. S. Steel Yard early this summer.

On the field, the RailCats have won with dominant pitching, patient offense and annually one of the best defenses in independent baseball. The RailCats have withstood major losses - either to retirement or affiliated baseball - and continued to produce wins in the Northern League. Only the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks have won more than the RailCats over the last four years and the 'Cats are one of only five teams to have won multiple championships in modern league history.
